The College has successfully imparts 17 Under Graduate programmes, 7 Post Graduate programmes, two PhD programmes and 2 Diploma programmes. The College is committed to provide quality education to make the students to realise and reach their fullest potential. The institution has been very keen to implement the curriculum which gets revised once in three years by the University of Kerala.

Methodology: Curriculum execution is analysed annually on a very scientific manner. Refined statistical tools are used to arrive at findings. A carefully designed structured questionnaire is circulated among the select students from various categories like girls, boys, backward students, etc. Information is collected in the same way from teachers and alumni also.


Feedback from the Students on Curriculum

A total of 16 academic departments are there in the College. There are 96 faculty members engaged in teaching. Among them 68 are permanent and the remaining work on contract basis. The numerical strength of the pupils stands at 2732. Sample size of the students is fixed as 10 for each year of UG batch and 5 for each year of PG batch. In this manner data is collected from 580 students spanning each level of UG and PG students. The findings are placed in the tables and charts given below:

- 4. Students are contended with the support of the study materials.


Feedback of Faculty about the Programme




Chart No. 3: Feedback of Alumni on the Programme
