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#### Report of the One Day Capacity Building Cluster Workshop for Resource Persons of the Scholar Support Programme in Government/Aided Colleges held at Devaswom Board College, Sasthamcotta

The workshop had been programmed and conducted as per the Programme Schedule given in Annexure I. There were 37 participants from various colleges as per Annexure II. The details of the members of faculty are also included in this.

The programme started with Inaugural Session of duration 15 minutes. The Principal Dr. K. Mohana Kumar officially inaugurated the workshop. The photograph of the same is attached herewith as Fig. 1.

After closure of the inaugural function, the technical session started. All the four sessions were handled by the resource person, **Dr. Chandra Prasad Sreredhar**, **Retired professor**, **IMG**. **In the first session** he focused on **the techniques to build successful interpersonal relationships**. He elaborated the topic with emphasis **on Boss**—**subordinate and also Teacher-student relationships**. He explained with examples and interacted with the participants through questions. Photgraph of this session is exhibited in Fig.2. This session was of 1.30 hours duration. After a short break for tea and refreshments, the next session commenced. It covered **the importance of communication and how to build effective communication through various strategies**. The resource person conclusively proved that effective communication is essential for the success of any interpersonal relation. He also guided the participants to make their skills more effective, pertaining to the counseling of those needy students who are approaching through SSP. Mr. Sreedhar also made an atmosphere of confidence to the participants. After 90 minutes, the session concluded and the gathering dispersed for lunch.

In the afternoon, the sessions were divided into two with a duration of one hour each. In the first half, the participants actively participated in group discussion and interaction in small groups **to sort out the various problems faced by the students**. Each team presented their findings. Some important problems they could figure out were lack of communication skills, unawareness about the goals and opportunities, low level of motivation, poor back ground, broken family, student politics, hectic schedule due to Semester pattern, bad manners, lack of confidence, insufficient guidance etc. Dr. Chandra Prasad Sreedhar supported the participants in figuring out the problems into those which need serious and special attention and those which need secondary care. He also explained the psychosomatic conditions faced by some students citing examples and clearly instructed how to solve such problems. He explained all the above points and had given some important points to be remembered while we prepare the students to face interviews. In the last session, the theme was what a teacher can do to help the students in solving the problems faced by the students. Each group presented their solutions to the problems. Some of these were to build confidence in the students, make efforts to find out the real family back ground of the students, motivate them with proper guidance towards the goal, help them to improve the communication skills, fill them with confidence etc. The resource person explained in detail how these could be accomplished.




Fig. 3. Consolidated Feed back

After conclusion of the technical sessions, some participants expressed their general feed back about this programme. Then the valedictory session started. It was presided over by the Principal. All the certificates were issued to the participants by the Principal, Chief Guest Dr. Chandra Prasad sreedhar and Dr. v. Jayasree, IQAC Coordinator. The Coordinator offered vote of thanks. The workshop came to an end by 04.00 PM. The valuable feed back from the participants were collected on 10 criteria as in Table 1. A consolidated report of the same is given in Fig.3.

In the feed back form, we have also included to write about the element which the participants appreciate/enjoy/think as the best about the workshop and also about the suggestions to improve. About 75 % of the participants have jotted their specific comments in this regard. All of them noted the presentation and the content of the subject matter by the resource person as the best part of the programme. A few participants mentioned about the usefulness of the citation of real examples as very useful for them to be a resource person of SSP. One participant requested for practical problem solving session and another one for enhancing the number of days of this kind of workshop to be 2. A few participants suggested that this kind of workshop should be organized one in each semester. One participant mentioned about the inclusion of more points

toward the improvement of the SSP programme implemented in Colleges. Majority of the participants enjoyed the group discussion session as they have mentioned. After perusing all these feed back and watching the sessions and interactions, we the local organizers feel that the workshop was relevant and fruitful to meet the objectives in the allotted time of one day. As the coordinator, I use this opportunity to place on record my sincere thanks to the special officer and his team of the Office of the New Initiatives for the endless support and confidence shown to myself. The enthusiasm and interaction of the participants are to be better appreciated. Above all the sincerity, willingness and scholastic approach shown by the resource person also need special mention. Then, the team spirit shown by the CLMC members of D. B. College and the minute and critical care offered by the Principal without which this could not have been materialized have to be mentioned with high priority.
