KSMDB College, Sasthamcotta, established in 1964 in Kunnathur taluk, managed by the Hon'ble Travancore Devaswom Board, and affiliated to the University of Kerala. The college was established with the objective of providing higher education to the children of economically backward areas. The college strives to provide holistic education so as to mold students into citizens who are endowed with a value system and environment consciousness, while pursuing theiracademic ambitions.

The College has done great efforts to meet the higher education commitment of the Travancore Devaswom Board through its various courses and programs. College has run a total of 17 Under Graduate programs,7 Post Graduate programs and two PhD programs.

METHOD ADAPTED

The college collects feedback from students, teachers, and alumnae from all department in curriculum development and enrichment. A carefully designed structured questionnaire was circulated among thestudents. and is collected through an offline mode. The same method was adopted for collecting data the teachers and alumni. Following the collection of data, the responses are analyzed.

STUDENT FEEDBACK ANALYSIS ON CURRICULUM

Currently a total of 2937 students are there in the College. Data are collected from 500 students spanning each level of UG and PG students. The findings are placed in the tables and charts given below

FINDINGS

The major findings of the student feedback are provided below:

- 1. Most of the post graduate & under graduate students are satisfied with the content of the programs.
- 2. Most of the students record that assignments, projects and seminars helps them to attain course outcome
- 3. Reference materials prescribed in the syllabus are useful and easily available in library. But some of the students' pointed out the difficulties they faced for online resources due to the lack of computer facilities.
- 4. As per the observation, current curriculum is capable of supporting students in their higher studies.
- 5. About 75% students suggested that elective courses offered are supportive with their core paper.

FACULTY FEEDBACK ANALYSIS ON CURRICULUM

Data forms are collected from 75 faculties working in the college. Among them 50 are permanent and the remaining are guest faculties. The results are analyzed and major findings are given in following table and charts.

FINDINGS:

The major outcomes of the faculty feedback are provided below:

- 1. Majority of the faculties are highly satisfied with the contents of programme.
- 2. About 70% of the faculties record that the assessment and evaluation process is helpful to measure the CO and PO.
- 3. More than 50% of the faculties are satisfied with the resources available in college for the curriculum delivery. Some of the faculties point out the implementation of some new technologies will be more beneficial for their teaching process.
- 4. The faculties reiterated that the adaptation of new concepts such as online and offline learning are beneficial to the curriculum delivery.
- 5. Majority of faculties pointed out that course curriculum has given good weightage between theory and application.

ALUMNI FEEDBACK ANALYSIS ON CURRICULUM

Alumni are considered as an asset of every college. An institution started way back in 1964, the KSMDB College has rich and vibrant alumni of its own. Apart from the general alumni, most of the Departments maintain their own individual alumni also. A total of 50 alumni were contacted and gathered their responses on the programme.

FINDINGS

The major outcomes of the interaction with the alumni of the College aregiven below:

- 1. Majority of the alumni believes that the contents of the curriculum was sufficient in terms of required quality and quantity.
- 2. Teaching learning process was interesting to about 70% of alumni. They also agreed that the present curriculum develops skill, concepts and imparts critical thinking in them.
- 3. Most of the alumni agreed that there were sufficient resources available in college library for their learning programme.
- Alumni pointed that the course content helped of students to pursue higher studies. However, 40% of the respondent pointed out their concern about higher education opportunities.
- 5. Curriculum of the course helped about 60% of alumni to pursue employment opportunities.

Conclusion:

The normal course of implementation of the curriculum follows a well-articulated plan. It is being implemented with utmost care. However, there are minor issues concerning the job prospects, availability of materials and higher education facilities.
